
Even though her parents were quite poor by American standards, they made no excuses and did everything for their daughter that I asked them to do for her.






The following Reduced to Oxidized GSH Ratio is only one example of the many different tests that improved on RS's Methylation Panel.




The blue columns represent the <u>clinic's average</u> laboratory value for the results of the test that was being evaluated (>800 ASD patients)

<u>Recall</u> the BLUE COLUMNS represent the <u>clinic's</u> <u>average</u> laboratory value for the results of the test that was being evaluated (>800 ASD patients)



<u>Note</u> the YELLOW COLUMNS represent patient RS's methylation panel laboratory results over a period of 3 years and 6 months



Here you can see patient RS's relative laboratory values, as compared to the clinic's average laboratory results, *started out much worse* but are NOW DOING BETTER!



Because the family lived far away from my clinic in a foreign country, things were always *more difficult* and *more costly* than that of my American patients. However, the family *never used those "facts"* AS AN EXCUSE to not do what I said to help their son significantly improve!
